

FIVE DAY DEVOTIONAL

Day 1 Devotional: Section Title: “The Wall Before the Promise”

Scripture: *Joshua 6:1–2*

“Now Jericho was securely shut up because of the children of Israel; none went out, and none came in. And the Lord said to Joshua: ‘See! I have given Jericho into your hand, its king, and the mighty men of valor.’”

Message:

Before you ever face your promise, you’ll often face a problem. Before you enter your blessing, there will be a barrier. The children of Israel stood at the edge of their inheritance, but Jericho-the wall-was standing in the way.

This wasn’t just a physical wall-it was a **representation of everything that says, “You can’t go further.”**

It was the “No” standing in front of God’s “Yes.”

It was the “shut door” in front of God’s open heaven.

But here’s the power of the text: *God didn’t speak to the wall; He spoke to Joshua.*

He didn’t ask the wall for permission-He gave **Joshua the vision.**

God said: **“See! I have given Jericho into your hand.”**

Wait—*what do you mean “See,” Lord?* All Joshua could see was a shut-up city, a fortified wall, and a battle ahead.

But God was calling Joshua to *see beyond what was standing in his way*-To see *by faith, not by sight.*

Sometimes the greatest obstacle in your way isn’t the wall-it’s your vision.

God has already declared victory, but your mind is still processing fear.

So here’s the word for someone today:

Don’t let what you see block what God said.

Don’t let the size of your obstacle blind you to the size of your God.

If God said He’s given it to you-then walk like it’s already yours. Praise like the wall’s already coming down. March like the breakthrough has already been released.

Because when you align your obedience with God’s strategy-walls fall.

Day 2 Devotion: “See It Before You Seize It”

Scripture Focus: “And the Lord said unto Joshua, See, I have given into thine hand Jericho, and the king thereof, and the mighty men of valour.” – Joshua 6:2 (KJV)

Devotion:

Victory doesn't begin with movement - it begins with vision.

Before the Israelites marched, before a trumpet was blown, before a single stone fell from Jericho's wall, God commanded Joshua to see what He had already done. “See, I have given...” - not “I will,” but “I already have.” God was declaring that the battle was already over - in the spiritual realm - long before it would be visible in the natural.

This is where many of us struggle: we want to see the wall fall before we believe, but God calls us to believe before we see the wall fall.

Too often we are paralyzed by what we see - high walls, locked gates, and fortified enemies - when God is calling us to be mobilized by what He has already spoken. The greatest barrier to breakthrough is not the wall in front of us, but the doubt within us. You can't walk in what you haven't seen in your spirit. If you can't see freedom, healing, restoration, or elevation, you won't walk in it - even if God has already declared it.

God told Joshua to see Jericho as already delivered. Not because the wall had come down - but because when God speaks a thing, it's already settled in heaven. Your job is to align your vision with His word.

What's standing in your way today?

A broken past? A system stacked against you? The voice in your head that says you'll never make it? Whatever it is - shift your vision. Stop measuring what you see against your capacity and start measuring it against God's promise.

Reflection Questions:

- Am I seeing my obstacle through my eyes or through God's promise?
- What victory has God already declared that I need to see before I seize?
- Where do I need to align my vision with God's word?

Action Step:

Write down three areas in your life where you feel stuck - and then find a scripture that declares victory in that very area. Declare it aloud until your vision aligns with God's.

Prayer:

Lord, open the eyes of my spirit. Help me to see beyond the wall and into the promise. I refuse to be discouraged by what's in front of me when You've already gone before me. Give me faith to see it, strength to believe it, and boldness to walk in it. In Jesus' name, Amen.

Day 3 Devotional Title: “Face It with Faith”

Scripture: Joshua 6:2 – *“And the Lord said unto Joshua, See, I have given into thine hand Jericho, and the king thereof, and the mighty men of valour.”*

Reflection:

What do you see when you look at the walls before you? Fear? Defeat? Delay? God told Joshua to “**see**” that the victory was already his—**before** a single stone had fallen. Faith is not about what your eyes see; it’s about what your spirit believes.

Even when nothing looks like it’s shifting, God says, “I’ve already given it to you.” Sometimes, the biggest wall we face isn’t outside—it’s the inner doubt, insecurity, or fear that whispers, *“You’ll never make it.”*

Joshua had to shift his **perspective** before the walls shifted in reality. You must do the same. See your Jericho already conquered. See yourself walking in the promise. That shift in sight is the starting point of your breakthrough.

Devotional Thought:

Today, God is challenging you to see the victory **before** it manifests. Not because of your strength, but because He said, “I have given it to you.” Walk in faith. Worship like it’s already done. Shout even when you’re still circling.

Prayer:

Lord, help me to see what You’ve promised, not just what stands in front of me. Give me eyes of faith to look past the walls and into the victory You’ve already declared. I trust that every wall before me is temporary. In Jesus’ name, Amen.

Day Four Devotion: From the Sermon: “What’s Standing in Your Way?”

Scripture Focus: Joshua 6:4–5 (KJV)

“And seven priests shall bear before the ark seven trumpets of rams’ horns: and the seventh day ye shall compass the city seven times, and the priests shall blow with the trumpets...”

Title: The Sound of Obedience

Devotional Thought:

By Day Four, the Israelites were walking in full obedience-circling the wall of Jericho daily without complaint, hesitation, or deviation. They did not know exactly how or when the wall would fall, but they trusted God’s strategy. God gave them a specific instruction: **walk, be quiet, and then sound the trumpet**. This wasn’t just about physical movement-it was a spiritual test of **discipline, faith, and patience**.

Many times, **what’s standing in our way** isn’t just the obstacle-it’s our unwillingness to follow God’s process when it doesn’t make sense. God’s methods don’t always look like solutions, but they are designed to build trust and obedience in us. Every silent lap around the wall was a declaration of faith. Every day of walking was a rejection of doubt.

Today, reflect on this:

Are you walking in obedience even when you don’t see results? Are you trusting God’s timing even when He tells you to stay silent?

Reflection Questions:

1. What is God asking you to do that feels repetitive or fruitless?
2. How do you respond when God’s instructions don’t match your expectations?
3. Is your faith strong enough to keep walking even when the wall hasn’t moved?

Prayer:

Lord, help me walk in obedience even when I don’t see immediate change. Teach me to trust Your voice, follow Your timing, and believe that every step I take in faith is part of the breakthrough You’re preparing. Let my silence be strength and my shout be victory. In Jesus’ name, amen.

Day 5 Devotion: “The Wall Will Fall”

Scripture:

“And it shall come to pass, that when they make a long blast with the ram’s horn... all the people shall shout with a great shout; and the wall of the city shall fall down flat...” – Joshua 6:5 (KJV)

Reflection:

By Day 7, the Israelites had walked in silence for six days, following God’s unusual battle plan. No weapons, no words-just obedience. But on the seventh day, everything changed. Their march turned into a shout. Their silence turned into sound. And their obstacle-the mighty wall of Jericho-crumbled at the sound of faith in motion.

Sometimes what stands in your way doesn’t need a wrecking ball-it needs your worship, your shout, your obedience to the voice of God. Walls don’t fall by strength alone-they fall by strategy, surrender, and sound.

You’ve walked long enough. You’ve been quiet long enough. Now is the season to open your mouth in faith. Your shout isn’t just noise-it’s prophetic. It declares, *“The victory is already mine.”*

What if the only thing standing between you and your breakthrough is your willingness to believe out loud? Don’t underestimate the sound of a surrendered life. Don’t withhold your shout when you’re this close to the promise.

Prayer:

Lord, I believe that what’s standing in front of me is no match for the God within me. I declare by faith that the walls in my life are falling-walls of fear, doubt, delay, and opposition. Strengthen me to obey, even when it doesn’t make sense, and teach me to worship before the wall falls. In Jesus’ name, Amen.

Today’s Challenge:

Lift your voice today-through prayer, praise, or declaration-and speak to the wall. Walk by faith and shout like the wall is already down.
